Parish Clerk's Report

At the PC meeting in February, Councillors discussed the following:

- Paddy's Pit
- D-Day 80
- Community Transport opportunities through BACT
- A local petition regarding Potter's Bridge on the B1127
- Blocked ditches in the village

East Suffolk Council Cllr Scrancher attended the meeting and informed councillors that: the Lowestoft Tidal Barrier Project has been halted as further funding is sourced; Seafront improvement is set to progress this spring; Redevelopment at Jubilee Parade in Lowestoft is due to begin this month. On a planning note, ESC has introduced a further route for planning applications, known as the Planning Committee Member Call-In Process.

The Clerk reported an update from the Police. UK website of 3 x reported crimes for the months of November and December 2023 on or near Mutfordwood Lane.

Following receipt of an expression of interest, it was agreed to co-opt John Armstrong onto the Parish Council. This was the last remaining space on the council.

This application is being dealt with by Suffolk County Council's Development and Regulation Committee.

Community Transport Service

BACT are a charity operating a community transport service in our area. They have supplied the following information.

"Passengers use our services to come into Beccles or travel to medical appointments, but we can also feed people through to bus stops for onward travel further afield such as Norwich, Lowestoft and Southwold.

We do not have sufficient resource to run regular bus services in your area, however, people can request our transport by booking in advance and use our community car service or the dial a ride (door to door). Services are available to all – young and old, who cannot use public transport including where there isn't any, as well as us connecting you up to public transport where it does run.

Everyone who uses our services pays a £20 annual registration fee and then fares are on top and vary depending on the length of the trip. The community car service is 45p per mile which starts from where the volunteer driver leaves their home to the passenger and then to the destination and back home again. The minimum single fare is £3.00.

'Dial a ride' is based on a single £3 for up to (5 miles trip door to door), £3.50 (5 – 9 miles) and £4 (10 – 14 miles). Return fares are double this. The minimum fare is £3 single.

If people can travel at the same time, when their transport is not time dependent from the same area, that is useful as it makes for more efficient travel.

We mainly use volunteer drivers, which we are very short of, so if you know of anyone in the villages you cover who would be interested in driving people from your parishes, please let us know, as we would be more than happy to co-ordinate trips. This keeps costs down for passengers and encourages friendships in local areas. We can also cover off the training, DBS checks and safeguarding courses that are required.

Fires - Consider your Neighbours

Concerns over smokey bonfires causing a nuisance to local residents have been raised. It is a common misconception that local by-laws exist to control bonfires. They do not. However, some of the chemicals emitted by bonfires can have serious health effects. It is unlikely that exposure to bonfire smoke will happen over a long enough period to cause serious harm to individuals, but it may be sufficient to cause temporary distress and acute illness in people who suffer from asthma, bronchitis or other respiratory disorders or heart conditions. So please – for those intending to have a bonfire first consider the weather conditions and the sort of material being burnt. Try and dry material out before burning and burn on less windy days when the smoke will rise rather than engulfing your neighbours.

Seeking Advice

When residents have concerns about local matters or have cause for complaint, the first port of call is to contact the Parish Clerk, Angie Colbridge who can advise on the best way to proceed or get action taken. However, if your concerns involve an emergency or an urgent issue the relevant, emergency authority/ies should be contacted immediately, rather than the Parish Clerk.

If the matter comes under legislation governed by the district council you can contact East Suffolk Council directly. Explain the issue and you will be passed on to the relevant council department. These points of contacts are going to be the best way to deal with issues especially if they are persistent issues. Furthermore, parish council meetings are open to the public and issues can be brought forward for discussion or consideration. It is helpful if you contact Angie Colbridge before the meeting, as the subject may require background information or research being carried out.

Mutford News is a Mutford Parish Council project and paid for by them. It is also limited in pagination so it is impossible to go into any lengthy discussion in print on any particular issue. However, it is in place, as far as is possible, to inform residents of where help or advice can be sought.

Reporting Issues with Roads and Pavements

In **emergencies**, such as a missing manhole cover, if a road needs to be closed or where there is a potential danger to life call Suffolk Highways Customer Services immediately on 0345 606 6171. The line is available 24/7.

However if the emergency is on a trunk road in Suffolk. e.g. the A12, then please call the National Highways Information Line on 0300 123 5000.

Less urgent issues in Suffolk such as potholes, damaged pavements, road flooding etc. can be reported online where you will be asked to pinpoint the location of the issue on the map and describe the issue. This tool can be found at:

www.highwaysreporting.suffolk.gov.uk Please note potholes of 40mm depth or less are unlikely to be repaired but will still be recorded for future reference.

Dog Fouling
