BUS ROUTES - URGENT NEWS

Suffolk County Council has been granted £1.8 million to spend each year in 2023/24 and 2024/25 on enhancements to the bus transport network. Some of this will be going to support existing services, some will be going into design work on Bus Priority schemes with the remainder of the grant supporting new or improved services at a local level where demand can be proven. Parish/Town Councils, Bus Companies and other groups are now being asked to submit ideas and suggestions for these improvements. At the next Enhanced Bus Partnership Passenger Group meeting on November 14th this will be discussed. If you wish to see Mutford and surrounding villages state an interest in this scheme we need to see a level of interest taken by local residents. Parish Clerk's report

At the PC meeting in October, Councillors discussed the following:

- Signage in the village including the state of repair and visibility of some signs.
- A small number of reported crimes in the village. These can be viewed on the police. uk website.
- The proposed Community Speedwatch Scheme. We have had 5 residents come forward to volunteer for this scheme and are looking for one or two more so that we can go ahead.
- The state of repair of some of the footpaths in the village.
- Holly Lane Bridlepath.
- Noise disturbance from aircraft flying over the village.

East Suffolk Council Cllr Rivett attended the meeting and informed those present that East Suffolk Council have launched a draft of their new strategic plan which they welcome comments on. Polling Stations in East Suffolk are also being reviewed.

As you may be aware there have been recent changes to the Highway Code to protect the most vulnerable road users i.e. pedestrians, horse riders and cyclists.

There has been a countrywide campaign "Pass Wide & Slow" particularly around passing horses and horse drawn carriages. We are a rural area and horse riders have very little option but to use the roads to get to the very small number of bridle paths. Many land owners no longer allow horses to ride along the edge of the fields due to various grants etc. Car drivers and motorcyclists appear to speed along narrow lanes with little understanding that there may be a walker, rider or cyclist round the next bend. Please use country roads carefully with these considerations in mind.

Countryside Code

Respect other people:

- consider the local community and other people enjoying the outdoors
- leave gates and property as you find them and follow paths unless wider access is available

Protect the natural environment:

- leave no trace of your visit and take your litter home
- keep dogs under effective control

Enjoy the outdoors:

- plan ahead and be prepared
- follow advice and local signs

Dog Fouling
