Only 'material planning considerations' will be taken into account. e.g. local planning policy or loss of amenity (daylight, sunlight, privacy), potential highways issues, wildlife/ conservation, potential noise/smells etc.

Mutford Walking Hub

Mutford Church has a very unusual, architectural feature for a country church: A medieval Galilee porch. These porches are often found at the western end of cathedrals and especially Cistercian abbeys and monasteries. Their original use was so persons (usually women after childbirth or at certain times of their cycle) barred from entry, could gather and observe the service, most notably when the 'host' (bread or wafer) is elevated prior to communion. In more enlighten times they were used as a place where processions would start and end and also a place where visitors or pilgrims could gather to see and take part in the service going on inside. They are rarely found on churches, and this is the only example of one attached to a round tower.

As time moves on and weather takes a toll on the structure we find that the porch roof is sadly in need of repair. When applying for grants, trusts and award-making bodies want to see that the building is important and useful to the community. Thus the Galilee porch has been set up as a Walking Hub and is now open. You will find that an information table has been put in place and a leaflet of many of the local footpath walks is also available. Please go and take a look.

Rural churches will need to be used in different ways, as well as for traditional church services, if they are to survive in the future. New ideas are always welcomed for consideration and the churchwardens are always approachable on this matter.

- leave no trace of your visit and take your litter home

- plan ahead and be prepared
- follow advice and local signs

Advice to walkers and runners on country roads

On roads with no pavements pedestrians should keep to the right-hand side of the road so oncoming traffic can be seen. Keep close to the side of the road and be prepared to walk in single file if you are in a group. If you come across a sharp right-hand bend it may be safer to cross to the left-hand side of the road to gain visibility and cross back after the bend. Do not cross the road on a sharp bend.

Reporting Issues with Roads and Pavements

In **emergencies**, such as a missing manhole cover, if a road needs to be closed or where there is a potential danger to life call Suffolk Highways Customer Services immediately on 0345 606 6171. The line is available 24/7.

However if the emergency is on a trunk road in Suffolk. e.g. the A12, then please call the National Highways Information Line on 0300 123 5000.

Less urgent issues in Suffolk such as potholes, damaged pavements, road flooding etc. can be reported online where you will be asked to pinpoint the location of the issue on the map and describe the issue. This tool can be found at:

Please note potholes of 40mm depth or less are unlikely to be repaired but will still be recorded for future reference.

To report a power cut or to report damaged power cable / poles

Call 105 to report a power cut. This is a free-ofcharge call from any network. Do not call your electricity supplier. Electricity suppliers are not responsible for the power lines that connect to homes or businesses.
