Parish Clerk's Report

At the PC meeting in September, Councillors discussed the following:

- The Parish Council Insurance renewal
- Code of Conduct, Standing Orders and Safeguarding Policy
- Play Area Maintenance
- Drivers travelling at inappropriate speeds on our narrow, rural roads
- Cases of Blue Tongue in livestock reported in the village

County and district councillors attended the meeting. East Suffolk Cllr. Scrancher introduced Cllr. Letitia Smith, newly elected district councillor for the area.

The Clerk noted that there were two reported crimes on or near Beccles Road, Mutford, on the Police.UK website during the months of May and June, one under the category of violence and sexual offences and one under the category of theft from the person.

Thank you to those who displayed bunting for the Tour of Britain on Sunday 8th September giving a warm welcome to all those involved in the event and visitors to the village.

During the summer, two residents worked a full day volunteering in the play area and hard court area as part of a 'Volunteer Day' allowed by The Food Standards Agency. Huge thanks go to Richard, Kim and the Food Standards Agency for their wonderful contribution to the community.

Road Safety on Village Roads

It has been noted that there has been further discussion about speeding vehicles in the village, not only on the Mutford Noticeboard Facebook page, but in general conversations that local people are having. They are also extremely concerned about the speed of large agricultural vehicles on our winding, narrow roads.

It is important to note that drivers can feel very safe in their vehicles with cornering and braking having improved no-end over the years but what is assumed as an open road around that bend, is a very bad assumption.

Because of Mutford's rural location the roads are used not only by cars and agricultural vehicles but by walkers, cyclists and horse riders. Furthermore, hidden driveways are a hidden danger too. Every road user expects safety and respect from other road users. If everyone does their bit towards driving safely and considers what might be moving slowly around the other side of a hidden bend then they could avoid traumatic situations for everyone including themselves. Furthermore, if farmers could impress upon the drivers of contractor's vehicles the dangers of speed on these roads, then that would be helpful. It is appreciated that the nature of contracts means that contractors rush around to get the job done quickly but at the same time there must be a responsibility to the community at large.

Mutford Parish Council will explore further measures with Suffolk County Council Highways Department. In the meantime all road users should be vigilant and it would be helpful if any continued breaches of road safety be reported to the Parish Clerk to back up calls for further measures to be taken.

You can report a blocked road gulley in Suffolk quickly and easily online. The Suffolk County Council Highways Reporting Tool allows you to report a new problem and monitor the status of existing reports.

or by Email: customer.services@suffolk.gov.uk or by phone Telephone: 0345 606 6171

Do not report a blocked drain online if:

- it poses an immediate danger to public safety call 0345 606 6171
- it's on a trunk road in Suffolk call the Highways England Information Line on 0300 123 5000
- it's on a private road, private land or a car park - this is the responsibility of the land owner or Anglian Water
- the drain is blocked by leaves and litter contact the borough or district council to clear this

Reporting a problem online takes about 2 minutes.

Reporting Issues with Roads and Pavements

In **emergencies**, such as a missing manhole cover, if a road needs to be closed or where there is a potential danger to life call Suffolk Highways Customer Services immediately on 0345 606 6171. The line is available 24/7.

However if the emergency is on a trunk road in Suffolk. e.g. the A12, then please call the National Highways Information Line on 0300 123 5000.

Less urgent issues in Suffolk such as potholes, damaged pavements, road flooding etc. can be reported online where you will be asked to pinpoint the location of the issue on the map and describe the issue. This tool can be found at:

Please note potholes of 40mm depth or less are unlikely to be repaired but will still be recorded for future reference.

To report a power cut or to report damaged power cable / poles

Call 105 to report a power cut. This is a free-ofcharge call from any network. Do not call your electricity supplier. Electricity suppliers are not responsible for the power lines that connect to homes or businesses.

Recycling Centre ('the Council tip')

You have to book a slot to use the recycling centre in Hadenham Road, Lowestoft. This facility is free to use for household waste (certain items like rubble, tiles, plasterboard etc., are charged for).

Open: 9 – 5pm Mon, Tues, Thurs, Fri, Sat, and Sun. Closed: Wednesdays.
