# British Cycling Tour of Britain is coming through Mutford

The final stage of Britain's biggest professional cycle race, The Lloyds Bank Tour of Britain Men, will be decided on a 158-kilometre (98½mile) final stage through East Suffolk, between Lowestoft and Felixstowe on **Sunday, September 8**<sup>th</sup> and it's coming through Mutford. The five day race begins in the Scottish Borders.

Although the East Suffolk stage will get underway at 11.00am from Lowestoft's Promenade, the actual racing will not start until 11.20am on Tom Crisp Way. The race will go through The Street in Carlton Colville, branch onto Hall Road and then onto Mutfordwood Lane at aboat 11.24am. It then goes through Church Road and along the Hulver Road. At the end it turns off right on the Benacre Road to Beccles at about 11.31am.

There will be a rolling road block as the race goes through. The race then heads inland via

Email: clerk.mutfordpc@outlook.com Tel: 07584 136402 Beccles and Bungay, and then south through Halesworth, Framlingham, and Saxmundham, before racing along the Suffolk coast between Thorpeness and Aldeburgh. The second half of the route takes in Snape, Wickham Market, Kesgrave, and Martlesham, before a run in and finish on Sea Road in Felixstowe. The stage is expected to finish between 2.08pm and 2.53pm.

The stage will feature three intermediate sprints – each with time bonuses – at Beccles, Aldeburgh, and Grundisburgh.

Exact details of the route can be found by scanning this QR code. If you are intending to watch the race in Mutford please walk, if possible, to your chosen viewing point in good time, as there will be limited parking.

The tour route will come into the village on Mutfordwood Lane and out via the B1127 Hulver Road so anywhere along this road would be appreciated.

# **Responding to Planning Applications**

By the time a planning notice is published in Mutford News the opportunity to comment is likely to have passed. Only 15 days is given for commenting from the time when the notice is validated or appears on the ESC Planning website.

If you are concerned about local planning applications keep a regular check on the East Suffolk planning page at:

publicaccess.eastsuffolk.gov.uk/online-applications Key in MUTFORD as the search area.

Only 'material planning considerations' will be taken into account. e.g. local planning policy or loss of amenity (daylight, sunlight, privacy), potential highways issues, wildlife/ conservation, potential noise/smells etc.

#### Norwich - Tilbury Pylon Route

Plans to facilitate the transfer of green electricity through East Anglia to the grid have been ongoing for some time now. The question is by which route and means can this be achieved? There are many issues, but the cheapest method is to build an overland link utilising large pylons, rather than putting them underground or by routing cables offshore. Although the route of the proposed Norwich to Tilbury Pylon route does not pass through our immediate area some of you may take an an interest as it will have a large impact on our county not only visually but in commissioning too. # Mindfulness Support for Older Adults

The Mindful Life Group is offering an online mindfulness course that is fully funded to support older adults (over 65) and carers or former carers in Suffolk. The course is designed by a clinical psychologist who is also a mindfulness teacher.

The course is based on the mindfulnessbased stress reduction course developed by John Kabat Zin but has been adapted for these populations. We have had really good feedback from participants, and we have found that it improves peoples' attention and memory, as well as reducing loneliness, low mood, stress, anxiety and chronic pain.

We currently have courses starting in October, all courses are fully online and are six weeks long. Places are free but limited to around 15 per course.

# Reporting Issues with Roads and Pavements

In **emergencies**, such as a missing manhole cover, if a road needs to be closed or where there is a potential danger to life call Suffolk Highways Customer Services immediately on 0345 606 6171. The line is available 24/7.

However if the emergency is on a trunk road in Suffolk. e.g. the A12, then please call the National Highways Information Line on 0300 123 5000.

Less urgent issues in Suffolk such as potholes, damaged pavements, road flooding etc. can be reported online where you will be asked to pinpoint the location of the issue on the map and describe the issue. This tool can be found at:

Please note potholes of 40mm depth or less are unlikely to be repaired but will still be recorded for future reference.

# To report a power cut or to report damaged power cable / poles

Call 105 to report a power cut. This is a free-ofcharge call from any network. Do not call your electricity supplier. Electricity suppliers are not responsible for the power lines that connect to homes or businesses.
