Scaffolding against St. Andrew's tower

In early 2019, Historic England piloted a Small Grants scheme to help churches undertake limited maintenance aimed at halting deterioration of the building.

The round tower at St Andrew's Church has likely existed for over 950 years and there have been many patches carried out over the centuries, as you can see from the mixed use of flint, rubble in-fill and brick. And more work is now necessary.

St. Andrew's Church has been successful in gaining a grant to patch up some areas of loose flint and brickwork on the tower. The work is, however, limited to around 2 square metres per wall. The scaffolding you can see against the tower is to allow the most serious hole to be filled.

There are other areas higher up the tower that will need to be addressed in the near future. If you would like to contribute to this much-needed work (however small an amount) please email Martin at mlwarnes@gmail.com
