Sunday 21st March - Census 2021

On Sunday 21st March, you will be asked to take part in Census 2021.

The national census, undertaken every 10 years by the Office for National Statistics (ONS), provides information on every household in England and Wales. This information is then used by a wide range of organisations to understand the changing population and its' changing needs for healthcare, transport, education etc.

People will be asked to respond online, with help available via phone, webchat, email, social media or text message. Paper questionnaires and large print formats will also be available if required.

It is a legal requirement to complete the census, although some questions are voluntary.

The information is confidential. No one can be identified from the census statistics that are published.

The first census was in 1801 and the most recent in 2011.

Did you know...

You can submit a comment on any planning application. You have 21 days from

- the date of registration of the application,
- or the date of the application details being officially advertised (where this is necessary),
- or the site notice being displayed,
- or the date of any letter sent to you asking for comments (whichever is the latest date).

Only 'material planning considerations' will be taken in to account e.g. local planning policy, loss of amenity (daylight, sunlight, privacy).

Home But Not Alone

East Suffolk Council's Home, But Not Alone scheme is a free phoneline which supports vulnerable people in Suffolk who may be struggling with the impact of Coronavirus and need urgent help.

If you have no other support from friends, family or neighbours, and are struggling for food, medicines or other essential supplies and are feeling lonely and isolated, call **0800 876 6926** (available 9am to 5pm, from Monday to Friday).

Assistance for the lonely and digitally excluded

Many services and social activities have moved online, leaving some older people digitally excluded.

East Suffolk Council (ESC)'s Community Partnership Board has piloted a loan scheme for Grandpads, a simplified tablet device designed for the older user. It has bigger buttons and speakers, pre-loaded content (e.g. music and local weather), an easy to navigate operating system, and a 24/7 personal help facility. Grandpads aim to help users connect with their family and friends via video calls and online socials, as well as accessing other services and social support. It has built-in internet access.

An initial 25 devices were loaned out to users who are aged over 65, lonely and who don't have access to a PC/tablet/laptop and Wi-Fi, or who do but don't have the skills to use it. ESC has now purchased some additional devices.

She recently began proton radiotherapy treatment in Manchester, which will continue for six and a half weeks. The family would like to thank everyone for their kindness and support.

Memories – and hope for the future

I moved to Mutford in 1968, and bought my house for £3,150 – which seemed a lot of money then! There was a school, shop, pub and a bus service to Beccles or Lowestoft. The Village Hall had just been built and was opened by Sir Stanley Rous, the President of FIFA and still Mutford's most famous resident.

My wife Jean and two young sons settled in and made new friends. We became part of the table tennis club, the football team and took part in the Youth Club helped by Roger Farr, Gerald Garrod and my wife. Joyce Boon ran the tuck shop. We had over 20 children from the village every week and had outings to other local clubs.

The new Village Hall was the hub of village life. I joined the committee and became the Chairman, a post I still hold today. Over the years the hall held children's parties, quizzes, bonfire night celebrations, craft fayres, fetes and New Year's Eve Parties.

I used to organise Christmas shows every year with Ivan Jacob, and 100 people came to every performance. The commitment eventually became too much and ended with a pantomime organised by Pam Cross in 2000.

The football teams disbanded after many successful years, but the table tennis has gone from strength to strength; we now have 5 teams in local leagues and have won many trophies.

More recently, the hall has hosted scarecrow hunts and filmed horse-racing, as well as regular lettings to the Monday Club, WI, Dog training, bingo, woodturners and table tennis. Although the hall is sadly closed at present, I'm sure the good times will return and we can welcome you all back to the village hall.

In the meantime, I have 2 DVDs that you can borrow: one is a story of Mutford which we made in 2000, and the other was made in 2008 to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the hall. Please contact me if you would like to borrow them.

Let's get our injections done and look forward to getting back to the village life that we all enjoy.

Coronavirus/ COVID-19 summary

The Government announced 4 stages to get out of the national lockdown in England, each at least 5 weeks apart.

Stage 1 – 8th March: all students to return to school.

Stage 2 – no earlier than 12th April: non-essential shops, hairdressers, gyms, libraries etc can open.

Stage 3 – no earlier than 17th May: most outdoor restrictions lifted; pubs, theatres, hotels can open.

Stage 4 - no earlier than 21st June: all limits on social contact lifted; weddings etc can resume.

Each stage is conditional on meeting various conditions e.g. vaccination rates, levels of hospitalisation/ deaths & impact of new variants.
