The benches can be used by anyone, of any age, and will promote simple acts of kindness that could make a difference to people who might be living alone and needing human contact.



## CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

### Summary of changes to lockdown from Monday 17<sup>th</sup> May [yet to be confirmed by Government]:

- People will be allowed to meet indoors in groups of six, or with one other household.
- Gatherings of more than 30 people outdoors will remain illegal.
- Domestic overnight stays allowed with people not in your household or bubble.
- Pubs, restaurants and other hospitality venues can serve seated customers indoors
- Weddings, receptions, and funerals can take place with up to 30 guests.
- Hotels and B&Bs can re-open
- International leisure travel to selected countries may resume

### From 21st June [to be confirmed]:

- All legal limits on social contact removed

### CURRENT PLANNING APPLICATIONS

- The original application for the siting of a cabin on my land was applied for in February 2016 ( DC/16/0688/FUL ) and permission granted in April 2016. Permission at the time was given for a period of 5 years, as this is now coming to an end I wish to now apply for full planning permission to be granted for my cabin to remain, as I still require secure storage for grass cutting equipment and the need for a shelter. Land Adjacent To Mutford Wood Mutford ESC status: Awaiting decision
- Construction of olive green steel open sided shelter for machinery and hay/straw storage. 15 Holly Lane Mutford. Suffolk NR34 7UX. ESC status: Awaiting decision

## Local elections – Thursday 6 May 2021

Residents in Suffolk will go to the polls in early May to have their say on who represents them at Suffolk County Council and who will represent them as the new Suffolk Police and Crime Commissioner.

The local polling station will be at Mutford Village Hall, with COVID-19 secure procedures including the use of hand sanitiser, floor markings and social distancing.

Face coverings will be required (for those who are not exempt) and you are encouraged to bring your own pen.

### Bank Holidays

There are two bank holidays in May: 'Early May Bank Holiday' on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> May, and 'Spring Bank Holiday' on Monday 31<sup>st</sup> May. The next Bank Holiday in England will be the 'Summer Bank Holiday' on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> August.

### Did you know...

Bank holidays were first introduced by a man named Sir John Lubbock who was a scientific writer, banker and politician. He drafted the Bank Holidays Act in 1871, which created the first official bank holidays.

Initially, it was just banks and financial buildings that would close, which is where the name comes from. But as time went on, businesses, shops, schools and the government all joined in.

England & Wales have 8 bank holidays each year; the country with the most bank holidays each year is India, with 21!

### Litter pick

The pandemic has meant that group activities such as litter picks have been very difficult to arrange.

However – if it's safe, you could take a bag and a pair of thick (gardening?) gloves and pick up a few bits of rubbish as you walk around the village. Thank you!

## Did you know...

There are 4 categories of rights of way:

- **Footpath** – for walkers & wheelchairs only. Cyclists and horse-riders are not allowed on footpaths.
- **Bridleway** (sometimes signposted with blue arrows) - open to walkers, horse-riders and cyclists.
- **Restricted byway** (sometimes signposted with plum coloured arrows) - open to walkers, cyclists, horse-riders and horse-drawn vehicles. They do not carry public rights for motor vehicles.
- **Byway open to all traffic:** the public have the same rights as with footpaths, bridleways & restricted byways, plus they can use a byway open to all traffic in or on a motor vehicle but the route is mainly used by walkers, cyclists and/or horses

Free public access to the site and car park. Shop & café are now open. The open-air viewpoints are available but the hides currently remain closed until 17<sup>th</sup> May at the earliest.

Wheelchair/ pushchair access on firm trails around part of the marsh. Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times.

Swifts were seen around the village in the last week of April, having completed their amazing migration from Africa. They will stay a few months then start their return trip from July.



Suffolk Wildlife Trust is promoting a campaign to 'Save Our Swifts', due to a 50% decline in numbers over the last 25 years. ## Did you know...

Hawthorn, seen in many mixed hedgerows around Mutford, is also known as a May Tree. The pale-pink blossom usually appears in May and is seen by many as a sign of spring turning to summer.

The hawthorn produces deep-red fruits known as 'haws' which are eaten by migrating birds, such as redwings, fieldfares and thrushes, as well as small mammals. The dense, thorny foliage makes fantastic nesting shelter for many species of bird.
