The Parish Council has received several complaints regarding vehicles parking on the verge or partly on the road on Chapel Road, near the church. These vehicles create a potential danger to other road users, as they try to pass the parked vehicles on the narrow lane.

The landowners/ tenants concerned have been asked to ensure that they (and any visitors) always park their vehicles completely off-road.

They have also been asked to ensure that hedging is cut back to maintain a better line of sight for all road users.

Make a note in your diary... The Mutford Scarecrow Hunt Weekend is BACK.


Saturday 4th & Sunday 5th September will see lots of people wandering the village looking for scarecrows that we hope YOU will be putting in your front garden.

Did you know...

Pheasants are native to Asia, but were introduced into much of Europe by the Romans, possibly arriving in the UK with the Normans in the 11th century.

Lane Names

Just because it says it on Google Maps does not mean it is right! Many lanes in Mutford are ancient highways; they were there prior to being metalled, and deep trenches were worn into the earth from wagons and horse-drawn carts resulting in high banks like those adjacent to Paddy's Pit or down The-run-of-water (see below).

My Dad started work in Mutford (split between Marsh Farm and Pond Farm at either end of the village) in 1941 at the age of 17. The names I give are from the names he used to refer to the roads and lanes that he would have picked up from the 'Old Boys' he worked with.

So, the road from Carlton Colville is (as Google maps says) Mutford Wood Land, up to the junction with Pond Farm Road just past 'Fleahall corner', when it becomes Church Road, and at the Mutford Crossings, Hulver Road.

Pond Farm Road runs up past Paddy's Pit to Roadside Farm, when it becomes Dairy Lane which goes on past the junction with New Road (to the A146), past Ash Farm, and Highlands Farm to the entrance to Marsh Farm.

The road from Roadside Farm, past Pond Farm and Wood Farm to the golf course, is Eades (pronounced Aids) Lane, after Eades Farm, just over the parish boundary into Carlton Colville.

The road from Mutford Crossings up to Dairy Lane is Beccles Road. Turn left into Dairy Lane and the road takes you off Dairy Lane into The-run-of-water, so called because for 20 metres or so it doubles up as the Hundred Drain, which forms part of our own Parish boundary, before separating North Cove and Barnby and running into the Waveney.

Contrary to popular opinion I don't know everything. I'd be grateful if another reader could a) correct me and, b) inform us of lane names to the south of the village, filling in the gaps.
