'All bird keepers in England (whether they have pet birds, commercial flocks or just a few birds in a backyard flock) are required by law to take a range of biosecurity precautions including <u>keeping their birds</u> <u>indoors</u> except in very specific circumstances.'

On-road parking – a reminder

Please do not park near the cross-roads of Hulver Road/ Mill Road/ Beccles Road.

The Highway Code (Rule 243) states that you must not 'stop or park... opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction'.

Obstructing the crossroads makes it potentially dangerous for other road-users who may be unsighted when turning in to or out of the side roads into Hulver Road.

Can all parishioners please ensure that all vehicles – including those of visitors, are parked off-road or away from the crossroads. Thank you.


Changes to Highway Code

Changes to the Highway Code came in to force at the start of February.

Guidance to drivers includes leaving a minimum 1.5 metres when overtaking motorcyclists, cyclists and horse riders. You should pass horse riders and horse-drawn vehicles at speeds under 15 mph and allow at least 2 metres space.

You should wait behind the motorcyclist, cyclist, horse rider, horse drawn vehicle or pedestrian and not overtake if it is unsafe or not possible to meet these clearances.

Did you know ...?

It is an offence under Section 1 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act of 1981 to intentionally take, damage or destroy the nest of any wild bird while it is in use or being built, or to intentionally kill, injure or take chicks or adults, or intentionally take or destroy any eggs.

Try to trim any hedges before the end of February. The RSPB recommend that you don't prune hedges or shrubs between March and end of August, to avoid disturbing nesting birds.
