

CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

The current Government guidance:

- To reduce the chance of catching COVID and passing it on, you are still advised to get vaccinated.
- The NHS has started contacting everyone aged 75+ and those aged 12+ who are severely immunosuppressed to get their 'Spring booster'.
- The general public will need to pay for lateral flow test kits from 1st April. Most vulnerable people will continue to get free tests if they are symptomatic.
- It is recommended that you continue to wear a face covering in crowded/ enclosed spaces, especially where you come into contact with people you do not usually meet. Health facilities including doctors' surgeries and hospitals will still require you to wear face masks, unless

Avian Flu

The whole of England is still designated as an Avian Influenza Prevention Zone (AIPZ).

'All bird keepers in England (whether they have pet birds, commercial flocks or just a few birds in a backyard flock) are required by law to take a range of biosecurity precautions including keeping their birds indoors except in very specific circumstances.'
