## St Andrew's Tower repairs - update

When the upper levels of St. Andrew's tower were inspected in 2021, areas of the round tower beneath 5 of the 8 faces of the octagonal belfry were found to be in a poor state of repair. Brick infill carried out in the 19<sup>th</sup> Century was failing, and seeded trees and grass were causing serious issues.

Work started on the repair in mid-April when scaffolding was erected and should be completed by mid-June unless weather intervenes.

St. Andrew's wishes to thank the villagers who raised over £500 at a Quiz Night, and for grants from Norfolk Churches Trust, the Round Tower Churches Society, the Suffolk Historic Churches Trust, the Benefact Trust and our District Councillor Craig Rivett.

The church will remain open at weekends until the end of October should you wish to look inside.

Both the northbound and the southbound carriageways between Capel St Mary and East Bergholt will be closed from 9pm to 5am every night until Thursday, July 21.

Both carriageways, which connect Ipswich and Colchester, will then be closed again during the same times of day between Saturday, 25<sup>th</sup> August 25 and Friday, 1<sup>st</sup> September.

Emails from info@rebate-ofgem.com, using the Ofgem logo, claim to offer an 'energy bill rebate scheme' worth up to  $\pounds450$  per household, directing recipients to a fake online portal, and asked to input bank details. This is a scam. Beware!!

- No glass/ No textiles
- No nappies
- No polystyrene
- No food scraps
