HOW TO DISPOSE OF YOUR CHRISTMAS TREE

If you subscribe to the green bin service you can place your tree in your bin on the scheduled collection day Wednesday 9th January – BLACK BINS

Wednesday 16th January – GREEN & BLUE

The collection scheme will accept trees providing they are cut up so that the bin lid is completely closed before collection. Tree branches/stems must not be any larger in diameter than 1.5 inches (4cm).

Alternatively, you can take your tree to the recycling centre: Hadenham Road, South Lowestoft Industrial Estate, Lowestoft, Suffolk, NR33 7NF (off Tower Road, via London Road-A12. Road opposite Screwfix)

9am – 4pm every day except Wednesday
