# Parish Clerk's Report



At the last PC meeting (5<sup>th</sup> September 2022), Councillors discussed a range of issues and agreed various actions including:

- A high volume of tip trucks had used Mill Road at the end of July. Following a conversation with a Councillor, a local farmer agreed to remind his contract drivers not to use the shortcut. MPC agreed that it was not able at this time to fund signs to advise HGVs against using the road.
- A resident suggested a bottle bank should be located in the village. MPC decided that there were no sites available that would not cause sianificant noise disturbance to local residents. Bottle available at banks are the main supermarkets in local towns.
- The rota-bounce play equipment, that has been out of action for several months, will shortly be available once more; spare parts will be fitted following generous grant-aid from District Councillors Craig Rivett and Jenny Ceresa.

#### Conserving the dark skies

The Mutford Neighbourhood Plan (MNP), was prepared by Mutford Parish Council and formally 'made' by East Suffolk Council in December 2019.

One of the objectives of the MNP was 'to reinforce the rural character of the village', including conserving the tranquillity and dark skies.

The MNP noted, 'the Campaign for the Protection of Rural England (CPRE) believes that darkness at night is one of the key characteristics of rural areas and it represents a major difference between what is rural and what is urban... During public engagement, many residents proactively expressed their enjoyment of the dark skies in the parish, and the importance of conserving them.'

With the shortening hours of daylight, it is timely to remind residents to try and keep external lighting to a minimum. Ideally, security lighting should use a timer or motion sensor, and be deflected downwards, in order to minimise the impact on our dark skies and disturbance to wildlife.
