Parish Clerk's Report

There was no PC meeting in January, but during the month the following were completed:

- Road-safety The Parish Clerk, and a Councillor, attended a meeting with a representative of Suffolk Highways, to discuss various issues including the possibility of signage warning drivers of the crossroads on Hulver Road, speed signs and flooding on local roads.
- Planning submitted responses to the proposed Anaerobic Digester plant on Copeland Way, Ellough and an Energy Recovery Facility, also in Ellough.
- Fly-tipping several dumps of rubbish were reported on Mutfordwood Lane, just off Church Road towards Pond Farm.

Did you know...?

The next District and Parish Council Elections are due to be held on 4th May 2023.

From this date, all voters in England are required to show photographic identification (photo ID) at polling stations before they are given a ballot paper. You are not required to provide photo ID for postal voting.

Accepted forms of photographic identification <u>include</u>:

- A passport or driving licence, issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or an FFA state
- A Blue Badge
- An Older Person's or Disabled Person's Bus Pass

If your photo ID has expired, it will still be accepted as long as the photograph is still a good likeness of you.

If you do not have any of the accepted forms of photo ID, you can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate in person, by post or online; this is a free photo ID document specifically for the purposes of voting.

Mutford's Neighbourhood Plan* says that 'During public engagement, many residents proactively expressed their enjoyment of the dark skies in the parish, and the importance of conserving them'.

Indeed, one of the 10 policies in the Plan aims to 'respect the dark skies that are characteristic of the parish'.

One of the benefits of dark skies is to see and enjoy the stars. You can take part in 'Citizen Science' and help the Campaign for the Protection of Rural England (CPRE) with their annual Star Count, to map where dark skies are and identify where light pollution from buildings and roads is a problem.

You can take part in the Star Count anytime between 17th – 24th February.

Waste Bin collection

Did you know...?

Waste from your black (general rubbish) bin is sent to the Energy-from-waste facility at Great Blakenham, near Ipswich, where it is burnt at high temperatures and used to generate electricity for over 40,000 homes.

What $\underline{\text{NOT}}$ to put in your black bin

- Batteries: these should be taken to the nearest collection point (there are bins at most supermarkets, and recycling centres)
- Liquid paint: small amounts (such as less than a 1/4 tin-full) of emulsion or acrylic paint can, once dry and solid, be double-bagged and disposed in the black bin or taken to recycling centre.
 To aid the drying process, take off lid and add sand, dirt or sawdust.

RECYCLING CENTRE ('Council tip')

Book a slot to use the recycling centre in Hadenham Road, Lowestoft.

Free to use for household waste. Open 9-4pm Mon, Tues, Thurs, Fri, Sat and Sun. Closed on Wednesdays.
