• DC/23/0039/FUL - Erection of grain store. Red House Farm, Hulver Road, Mutford. Suffolk NR34 7UL

ESC status: Awaiting decision

DC/23/0019/FUL - To build a red brick single storey (Family room) extension on the eastern side of the cottage measuring 4.6m x 4.6m. This would replace the current old lean to stores and would incorporate a pitched roof finished below the eaves of the main property. preliminary plans show this extension set back a metre from the front wall of the host building. To build an oak - framed single car port with pan-tiled roof positioned at an angle, close to the front south western corner of the property. A small detached studio outbuilding at the west side of the plot alongside of the dwelling, this would have as weather boarded finish and a low hip roof. A small summerhouse postioned at the northern end of the garden with a low hipped roof and waterboarded finish. ### **CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)**

If you have COVID-19 you should try to stay at home. Most people cannot get free COVID-19 tests. You can buy tests in shops but you cannot report the result to the NHS.

A COVID-19 vaccine booster dose is no longer available. Some people at increased risk, for example, because of age or certain medical conditions, may be offered a seasonal booster later this year. The majority of bus journeys in England will continue to be capped at £2 per trip until 30<sup>th</sup> June; the scheme was originally due to finish at



the end of March but has now been extended for a further 3 months.

An adult return trip by bus, for example from Barnby to Norwich, will cost  $\pounds 4$ .
