- DC/23/0019/FUL To build a red brick single storey (Family room) extension on the eastern side of the cottage measuring 4.6m x 4.6m. This would replace the current old lean-to stores and would incorporate a pitched roof finished below the eaves of the main property. To build an oak - framed single car port with pantiled roof positioned at an angle, close to the front south western corner of the property. A small detached studio outbuilding at the west side of the plot alongside of the dwelling, this would have as weather boarded finish and a low hip roof. A small summerhouse positioned at the northern end of the garden with a low hipped roof and waterboarded finish. #### Local elections – a reminder

The next District and Parish Council Elections will be held on 4<sup>th</sup> May 2023.

All voters in England now need to show photographic identification (photo ID) at polling stations before they are given a ballot paper. You are not required to provide photo ID for postal voting.

A wide range of photo ID will be accepted including:

- A passport or driving licence, issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or an EEA state
- A Blue Badge
- An Older Person's or Disabled Person's Bus Pass

If your photo ID has expired, it will still be accepted as long as the photograph is still a good likeness of you.

If you don't have an accepted form of photo ID, you can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate in person, by post or online; this is a free photo ID document specifically for the purposes of voting.

#### CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

A spring booster vaccine against Covid-19 is to be offered to everyone aged 75+, care-home residents and anyone extremely vulnerable aged five and over, There should be a 6-month gap since the previous jab.

# Please slow down

The 'Speed Indicator Device' (SID) is currently located on Hulver Road, between the crossroads and Newson Avenue.

During a sample week (1<sup>st</sup> -7<sup>th</sup> February 2023):

- an average 367 vehicles each day passed the sign, travelling towards the village;
- an average 211 vehicles each day exceeded the 30mph speed limit (equivalent to 58% of all vehicles);
- on each of the 7 days, at least one vehicle was recorded as travelling in excess of 50mph.

Please slow down. Respect other road users.
