## Parish Clerk's Report

At the PC meeting in May – the Annual meeting of the PC, Councillors discussed a range of issues including:

- Elections Jenny Sheahan had decided to stand down as Chair, due to her imminent move away from the village. Martin Warnes was elected Chair, and Neil Glendinning Deputy Chair of the PC. There are at least 2 vacancies for new Parish Councillors – see box to the right.
- Finances The accounts for 2022/23 were approved and signed off. The full set of financial figures will be available online in due course: mutford.suffolk.cloud/finance/
- PC noticeboard repairs to the board were due to take place in late May; funding was provided by Suffolk County Council.
- Bonfires following an issue raised by a resident. You cannot burn domestic waste if it produces noxious fumes and/or if it causes a nuisance to other residents.

District Councillors Craig Rivett and Myles Scrancher attended the meeting.
